KPC SUPPORTS ELDORET CITY MARATHON

Kenya Pipeline Company (KPC) extended her generosity once again with a donation of Kenya shillings 500,000 to go towards the Eldoret City Marathon held in Eldoret, Uasin Gishu County and whose mandate is to conserve the environment.

Uasin Gishu Governor Jackson Mandago, Nandi Governor Stephen Sang, Elgeyo Marakwet Governor Alex Tolgos, Hon. Consulate of Kenya in the Hellenic Republic, Vicky Pantazopoulou, two-time Olympic gold medalist Kipchoge Keino and world marathon record holder Eliud Kipchoge among other dignitaries graced the third edition, Eldoret City Marathon.

The organisers decided to take practical steps to facilitate discussions about climate change by adopting "Climate Action" as the theme of the marathon. Speaking at the function Governor Mandago said the race's Climate Action theme will be sustained and will continue to encourage the corporate world to adopt forests in Uasin Gishu and neighbouring counties. "I have adopted parts of Kapseret forest and I have already planted bamboo to conserve water sources. We are working with world record holder Eliud Kipchoge in the forest adoption campaign," he said.

Sang on his part noted that tree planting needs to start as early as now to ensure there are sufficient forest covers years down the line. "There is a risk of desertification if reforestation is ignored until it's too late." He further added that Nandi County was honoured to be part of this event and would continue supporting the marathon whose agenda was noble by sending athletes from the North Rift Economic Block (NOREB) to participate. He concluded by inviting athletes to the Ndalat Gaa Cross Country to be held in October 2021 in Nandi county.





The day before the marathon organisers led a tree planting exercise at Eldoret Arboretum and Timboroa that was characterised by a show of corporate colours. The target was to plant at least ten thousand tree seedlings in partnership between the marathon sponsors and partners, the exercise was officiated by Governor Jackson Mandago. The Governor, stressed the importance of protecting our environment by planting of trees to reduce air pollution and bring down global warming. Mercy Kipchumba won the ladies category and Victor Kipchirchir won the men's category with a new course record.

While access to quality healthcare is a constitutional right, it is apparent that many Kenyans cannot afford to pay for health services in public or private hospitals, hence their decision to take advantage of the free medical services offered during the camps.

Statistics show that only about 20% of the Kenyan population are covered under the National Hospital Insurance Fund (NHIF) which therefore means that as many as 80% of the Country's population (about 35 million) do not access quality healthcare coverage. The ripple effect of this is that other household's needs are affected thus stunting economic wellbeing and lifestyle of most of our people.

In his statement, KPC MD Dr Macharia Irungu said, "KPC has and continues to make a positive impact on society through the improvement of the lives of individuals, groups and communities across the country.
